Things to Know

Bag Checks and Clear Bag Policy

All bags must be checked upon entry into the Tabernacle. To help create a safe and smooth experience for everyone, we strongly encourage guests to bring no bags when possible. Clear bags only are allowed. Bags must be transparent and made of plastic, vinyl, or PVC.

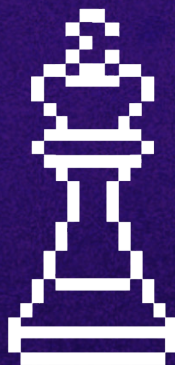
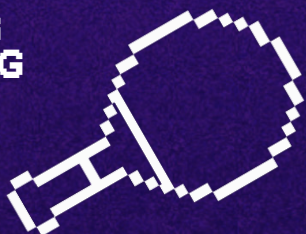

- Limit of 15 minutes per game.

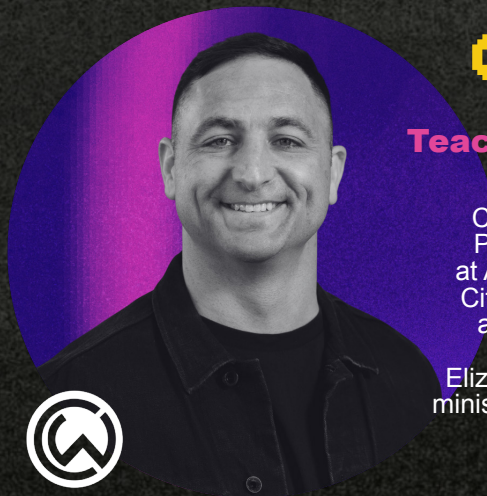
- First to 11 and win by 2 by 1s and 2s.

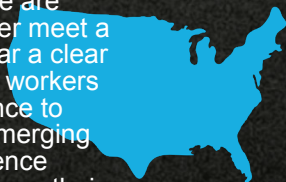

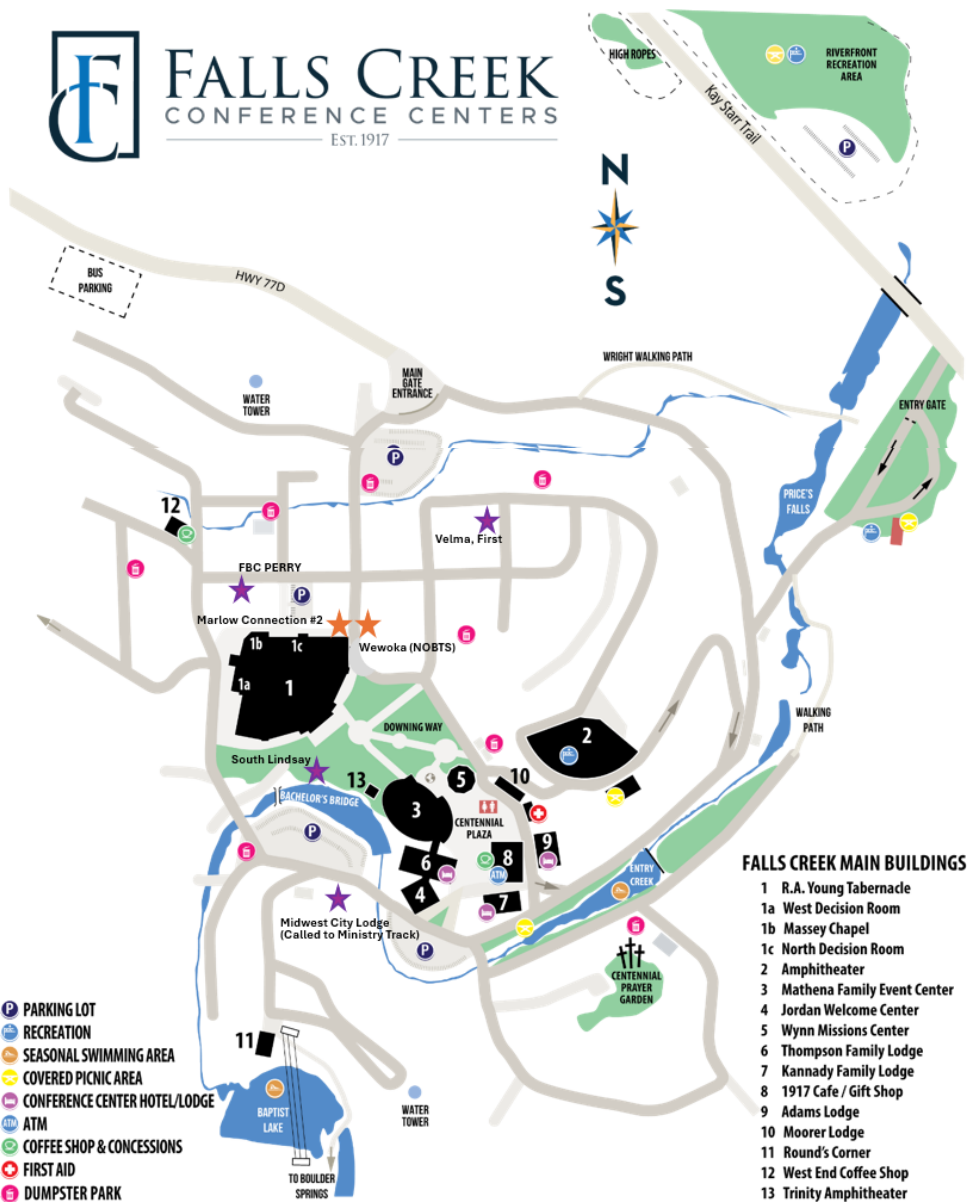

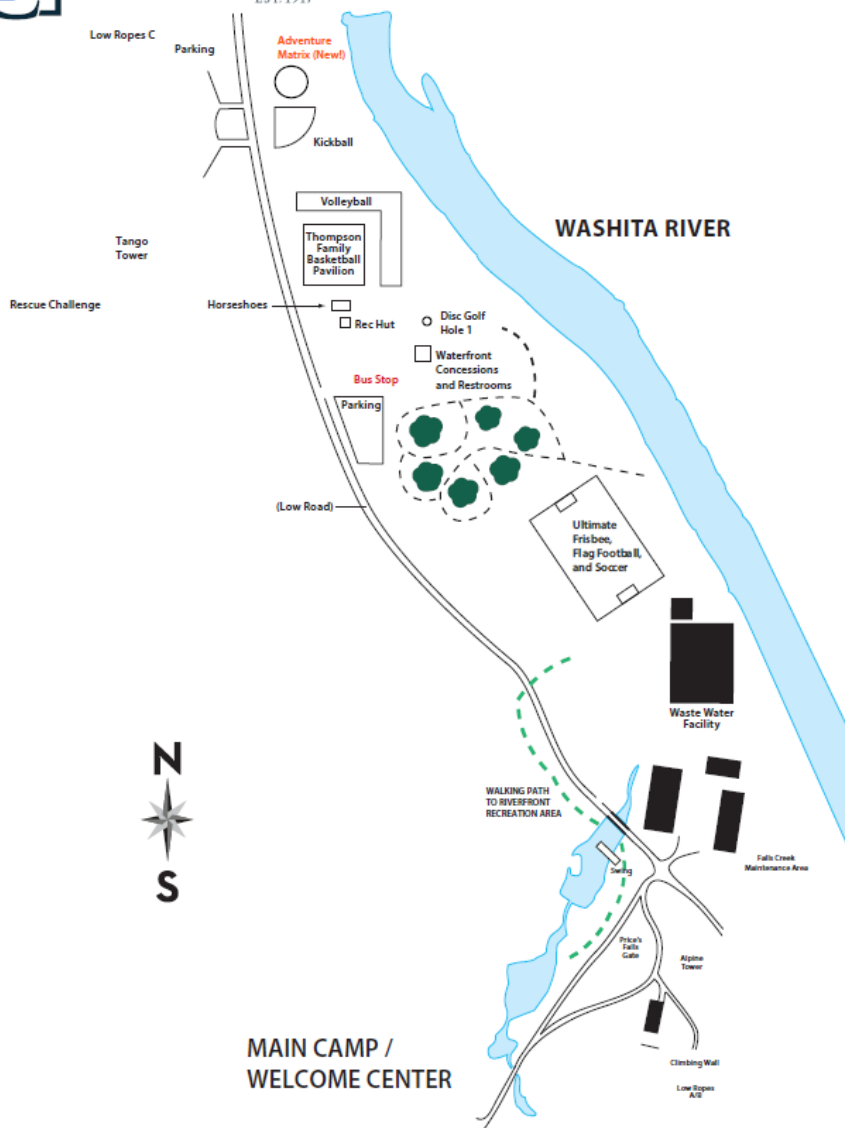
